Sharon Springs will be buzzing with the 14th annual Rattlesnake Roundup Saturday and Sunday.

The festival has added some new performances this year. The Koshare Indian Dancers from La Junta, Colo., will give three performances on Saturday. The dancers are Boy Scouts known around the world for their authentic American Indian dancing.

Comedian and magician Rex Getz, a Kansas entertainer, will perform Saturday and Sunday.

There will be a petting zoo, moun-

tain man camp, music, a Kansas Highway Patrol rollover exhibit, and food and novelty or craft vendors. A 5K run sponsored by the Sharon Springs Ministerial Alliance will begin at 8 a.m. Saturday, and the Economic Development Association will serve breakfast from 7-9 a.m. at the fairgrounds.

The "Fangs and Rattlers" and "Rattlesnakes Wranglers" professional handlers will perform with the newly captured snakes both days. A display of native snakes and a research pit provided by the

Sternberg Museum of Hays will be an educational highlight. All snakes are displayed in a specific area, which can be avoided by those who choose not to look.

The festival starts with a ham-and-bean supper 6 p.m. Friday evening at the Wallace County Fairgrounds. The gate opens at 9:30 a.m. Saturday, and the last show of the day will begin at 4:30 p.m. Sunday, the festival opens at 10:30 a.m., a drawing will be at 3 p.m., and the measuring of the largest snakes will be at 3:30.
