

Cowgirls finish fourth at Lakin Invitational

The Goodland High girls golf team placed fourth Saturday at the Lakin Invitational at the Louck's Park Municipal Golf Course.

Eight teams competed with each golfer playing 18 holes on the par-36 nine-hole course. The top 15 players won medals.

Sophomore Sammie Raymer placed 11th, shooting a 104, and senior Julie Leiker finished 13th with a 105. Sophomore Eryn Topliff shot a 116 for the Cowgirls with freshman Chelsie Gausman just one stroke back.

Senior Sami Philbrick and junior Amber Webster also played in the varsity competition, shooting 131 and 123.

"The team played a lot better today," said Coach Connie Livengood. "They are improving and doing a better job at positioning their shots. I'm extremely happy for Julie, as she shot a personal best to medal 13th in a field of good golfers."

Three golfers shot an 89 for the tournament. After the scorecard tie-breaker, Cheyenne George of Syracuse

was awarded the gold medal with Val Gustafson and Jen Koops, both of Ulysses, placing second and third respectively. George's teammate MacKenzie Simon was fourth

with a 90.

The Lady Bulldogs of Syracuse won the tournament, scoring 376. Ulysses was second with 390 and Lakin was third with 433. Goodland's score was 442.

Holcomb was fifth with 450 points, followed by Larned with 469, Liberal with 488 and Sublette with 548. Hugoton and Trego Community of WaKeeney both had players competing, but not enough for a team score.

At a junior varsity tournament in Syracuse last Thursday, freshman

Michelle Smith led Goodland's effort with a personal best 57 to place fifth. Sophomore Heidi Yonkey also medaled, shooting a 63 for 10th place.

Other Cowgirls competing there were sophomore Holly Kibel (68), junior Kerri Bellamy (70) and freshman Natasha Cecil (77). Sophomore Tehnee Ridder and freshman Danielle Pettibone both shot a 79, and freshman Courtney Sheldon had an 81.

The tournament was held at Syracuse's nine-hole par-36 Tama-

risk Golf Course.

The Cowgirls' final tournament before the regionals will start at noon (Mountain Time) in Syracuse.

Goodland's regional tournament will be Monday at the Big Creek Golf Course in WaKeeney. The top two teams and the best five players who are not members of those teams advance to the state tournament the following Monday at the Terrydine Country Club in Andover.

Broncbusters win fourth football game

The Broncbusters of Garden City Community College won their second straight game in front of a home crowd Saturday, defeating Highland Community College 57-20.

Two freshmen on Garden City's roster are former Goodland Cowboys.

Derrick Raymer is the team's punter, averaging over 36 yards per kick going into Saturday's game with his longest going for 58. Seven of his 25 punts were touchbacks and he has had one blocked.

David Livengood, who like Raymer is a 2005 graduate of Goodland High, has seen action in four of the Broncbusters first five games, mostly on special teams. As a backup tailback, he has rushed for seven yards on three carries.

Garden City, now 4-2 overall, faces a challenge this Saturday when it visits Coffeyville Community College. The Red Ravens,

ranked No. 2 in last week's National Junior College Athletic Association poll, improved to 6-0 Saturday after beating Fort Scott 49-0.

Butler County Community College has been the nation's top-ranked team since the second week of the season. The Grizzlies also improved to 6-0 Saturday with a 65-14 victory over Hutchinson Community College.

Butler County visits Independence Community College on Saturday. The Pirates won their second game of the season last Wednesday, defeating McPherson College's junior varsity 49-0.

In other games around the conference this Saturday, Highland goes on the road to face Hutchinson and Dodge City heads to Fort Scott. Dodge City defeated the U.S. Air Force Academy prep school 28-23 Saturday to even its overall record at 3-3.

The Brewster High School volleyball team improved to 17-2 for the season, winning all three of its matches at a home quadrangular meet last Tuesday.

The Lady Bulldogs defeated Triplains High of Winona 27-7, 25-13, Greeley County of Tribune 25-14, 25-9 and Wallace County of Sharon Springs 25-12, 25-11.

"Great teamwork was the key to our success," said coach Lynda McKee. "Our defense was much improved and we passed, served and hit the ball well on offense."

Senior Caitlyn Rush led the team with 22 kills for the meet. Junior Avery Schultz had 13 kills, and seniors Jalyne Reid and Kasie Stevenson both had seven. Reid led the Bulldogs in assists with 26.

Other matches in Brewster Tuesday saw Wallace County defeat Greeley County 25-11, 25-7; Tri-

plains defeat Wallace County 25-17, 25-7; and Greeley County defeat Triplains 25-18, 25-17.

The Bulldogs dropped one spot to No. 4 in last week's Class 1A rankings by the Kansas Volleyball Association.

Brewster's next court action will start at 3:30 p.m. today at Max Jones Fieldhouse where it will face Decatur Community High of Oberlin, Rawlins County High of Atwood and the host team the Goodland Cowgirls.

In other action around the Western Kansas Liberty League last week, on Tuesday, the Lady Warriors of Grinnell won both their matches at a home triangular meet defeating Healy 25-16, 25-22 and Golden Plains High of Rexford 25-17, 25-17. In the other match, there Healy defeated Golden Plains 25-20, 25-15.

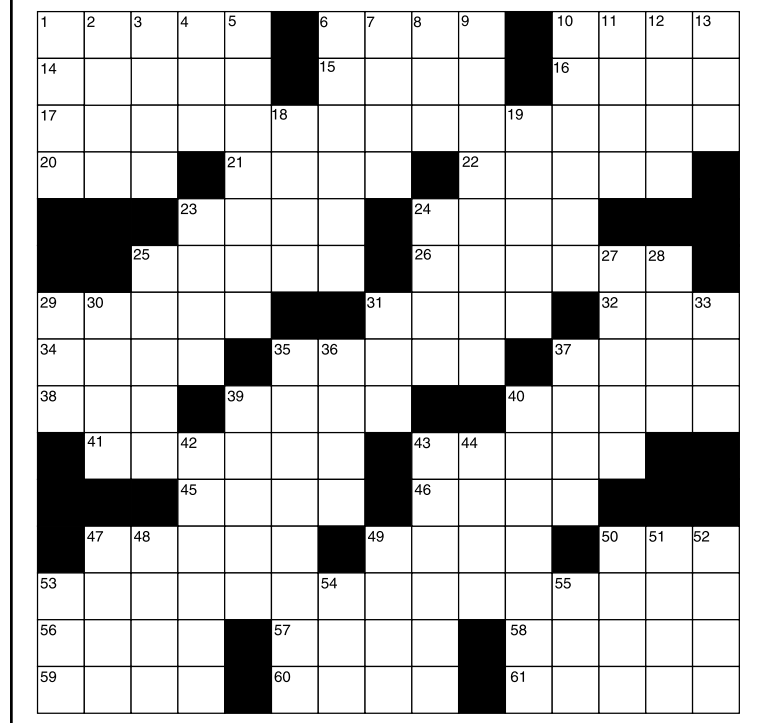
