Grant boys lose seesaw battle

Fans watching Tuesday's eighth-grade boys A-team basketball game in Max Jones Fieldhouse got to see something unusual as Hoxie took a 14-0 lead, then the Grant Junior High Mustangs wrestled it back with 16 straight.

However, it was the Hoxie Indians who led Goodland at halftime 28-21 and throughout the second half to win the game 45-39.

Hoxie jumped out to a quick 7-0 lead in the first two minutes of the first period then continued to frustrate the Mustangs while increasing its lead to 14-0.

After Grant coach Travis Witman called a time out, the Mustangs picked up the tempo, scoring the next seven points. That Hoxie's lead in half by the end of the first quarter.

The Mustangs kept their momentum in the beginning of the second period, scoring seven straight to tie the game at 14 with just under four minutes left. Ten seconds later, after a Hoxie turnover, Teather Dautel scored a basket to give the Mustangs the lead 16-14.

A basket by the Indians tied it up again at 16, then Dautel scored three straight making it 19-16. Later, a basket by Hoxie's Dillon Saalmans tied the game at 21.

The Indians then scored seven

straight to close out the half with a 28-21 lead.

The Mustangs outscored Hoxie 11-6 in the third period, narrowing the Indians' lead to 34-32 going into the fourth quarter. Late, with Hoxie leading 42-34, a free throw by Ben Waugh followed by two more by Colton Nelson got Grant to within five at 42-37.

Waugh next scored a basket to make it 42-39 but the Indians scored the final three points to win 45-39.

The loss evened the eighth-grade Mustangs' record at 1-1.

Landon Brenner led Grant with 14 points. Waugh scored eight points, followed by Nelson with seven and Dautel with six. Kevin Amthor and Jay Cotter each scored two.

The eighth-grade B-team score was not available at press time.

At the old high school gym, the seventh-grade Mustangs A-team defeated Hoxie 30-20 for its first win of the season. In the following B-team game, Hoxie beat Grant 19-10.

The next hoops action for the Mustangs will be Tuesday, with the eighth graders facing Colby at Max Jones and the seventh graders traveling to Colby.

The action at both locations starts at 3:30 p.m. (Mountain Time).

The Colby Community College women's basketball team started its season by going 2-1 at the Breakfast Rotary Classic this past weekend at South Plains College in Levelland, Texas.

The Lady Trojans opened their campaign with an 82-58 win over Northern Oklahoma State College on Nov. 3, the first day of the tournament. Colby led 41-35 at halftime, then outscored Northern Oklahoma 41-18 in the second half.

Sophomore Rita Kollo led Colby with 28 points, followed by freshman Jamie Schroeder with 18. Kollo also led the team in rebounds with 11, one more than sophomore Ivana Mijalcevic.

The next day the Trojans played the host team South Plains. Colby fought its way to a 22-21 lead, but was outscored by the Lady Texans 37-33 in the second half, losing 58-55.
