Baler building gets walls at transfer station

The county may need to drill a monitoring well closer to the city water well north of town to be sure contamination from the old county landfill isn't seeping into Goodland's water supply.

Another suggestion would be to consider paying the landowner north of the old landfill to plant corn and use of his irrigation well. The idea is that pumping the irrigation well could pull the contamination away from the city well.
