Grapplers win three state titles

Kansas League schools became state champions, with two winning at the Class 4A meet in Salina and the other at the Class 3-2-1A tourney in Hays.

Goodland Junior Brett Bahe won the Class 4A championship at 119 pounds by taking a 9-1 major decision over Dustin Bowen of Rose Hill at the Bicentennial Center. Bahe started the meet with a firstround pin over Brandon Hayes of Spring Hill.

In the championship quarterfinals, Bahe won a 7-3 decision over Concordia's Dustin Dooley, then pinned Ian Seaton of Bonner Springs in the third period of their semifinal match.

This was Bahe's second straight state title. Last year, as a sophomore in Wichita at 112 pounds, he took the gold. Bahe placed fourth at 103 pounds as a freshman in 2004

Bahe finished 36-2 overall for the season. His older brother Blayze, now a sophomore at the University of Northern Colorado in Greeley, won the state title at 119 pounds as a senior in 2004.

Colby senior Cole Garcia, last year's state champion at 140 pounds, defended his crown with an 8-5 decision over Alonzo Mundy of match. Garcia started the meet by pinning Brice Biehler of Louisburg, then won a technical fall, 18-2, over was second at 215.


