## Don't give account number to person on phone

Dear Attorney General Kline: I recently received a phone call from a man claiming to be with the Federal government who told me that Medicare had extra funding that had just been released. He then asked for the name of my bank and my account number so this money could be transferred to my account. It was at that point I informed him I would do no such thing and hung up. Did I do the right thing?

Dear Kansas Consumer:

Yes, you handled the situation properly. Congratulations for recognizing this as an attempted theft of your identity. This is a very common form of what is known as a phishing scam."

Identity theft continues to be a rapidly growing crime. Those who fall victim to this crime have been known to spend endless hours and many dollars in an attempt to undo


