

200 cars race in Flatlander

Races for the 17th annual Flatlander Fall Classic gave fans more than 12 hours of high-speed action Friday and Saturday on the dirt track at the Sherman County Speedway.

Track conditions were great Friday night, with 122 cars entered. A cold north wind on Saturday brought the number down to 119.

Alex West, president of the Sherman County Racing Association, said the car numbers were down a bit and the cold on Saturday reduced the grandstand crowd. West said the record for one night of racing is about 130 cars, but he was pleased with the turnout.

West said the attendance money for the two days was about \$4,000 to \$5,000 less than last year, and that will make it harder to pay all the bills.

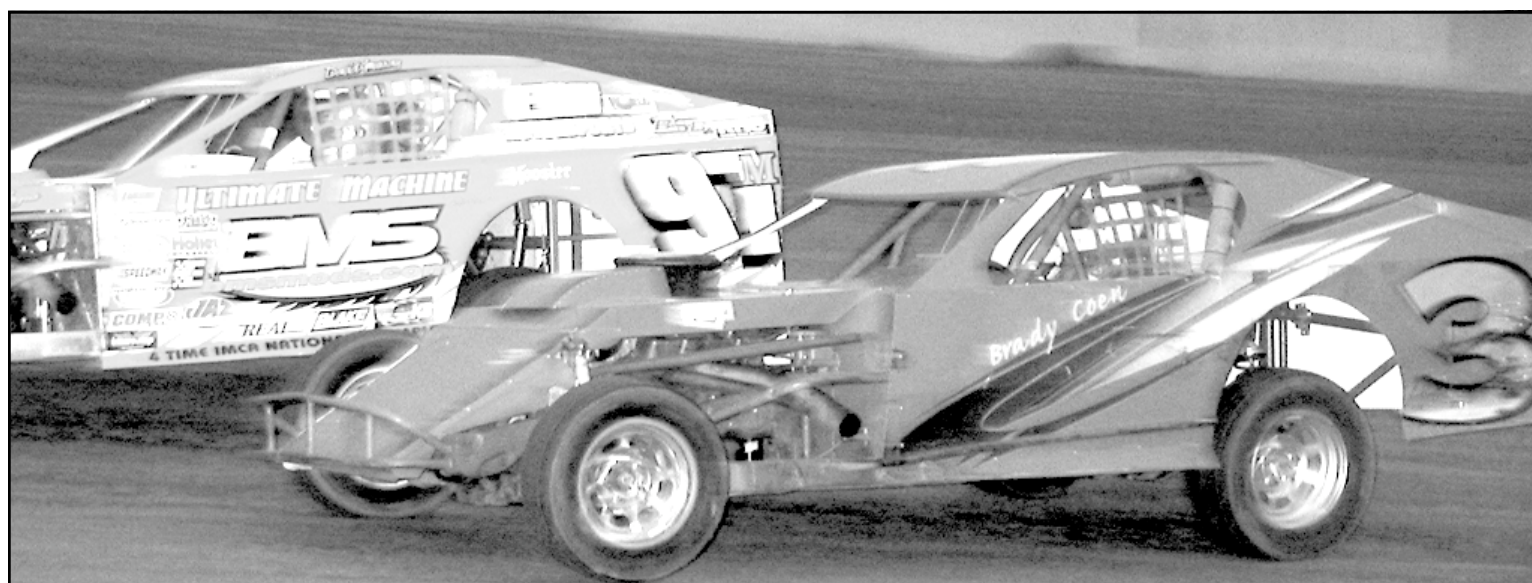
"Over all it, was a pretty good year," West said. "We had a good show every race."

West said there were quite a few accidents that slowed the races down this weekend, but he thought the track was rougher on Friday after the rain Thursday.

"We got it in shape for Saturday," he said, "and some of the drivers thought we did a good job on the track. We have had some good sponsors, and Goodland Greenline really helped by letting us use a tractor for every night."

On Saturday, drivers for each class — Mini Stock, Econo, Bomber, Stock and Modified — drove and parked in front of the grandstand as they were introduced.

The track champions for each class got a trophy as they were introduced in front of the grandstand on Saturday. Jacob Long (car 71) of Burlington won the mini-stock class; Roger Snethen (S5) in econo; Jeremy Blackwell (25) of Gem in bomber class; Randy Tipton (9) of Weskan in stock; and Darren

Coyotes win home opener

The Kansas Wesleyan University football team won its home opener Saturday, defeating the University of St. Mary 3-0 at Martin Stadium in Salina.

The Coyotes played the visiting Spires to a scoreless tie in the first half. Wesleyan scored the game's only points when Anthony Padilla kicked a 35-yard field goal with a little over 10 minutes left in the third quarter.

A pair of interceptions by junior defensive back Willie Johnson in the fourth quarter helped the Coyotes hang on for their third straight win.

Kansas Wesleyan, now 3-0, rose two spots to No. 12 in the latest poll

by the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics. St. Mary fell to 1-2.

The Coyotes travel east Saturday to play Ottawa University, which lost to McPherson College last weekend 26-7 and fell to 0-3.

In other action last weekend around the Kansas Collegiate Athletic Conference, Bethel College improved to 3-0 by beating Tabor College 26-10 and Bethany College defeated Southwestern College in overtime 21-14.

In nonconference matchups, Friends University defeated Haskell Indian Nations University 7-0 in Wichita and Sterling College lost on the road to Benedictine Col-

lege 6-0.

On Saturday, Tabor visits Bethany in Lindsborg while Southwestern plays Haskell in Lawrence for a nonconference game.

Bethel, now ranked No. 24 in the national poll, travels to Sterling. St. Mary takes on No. 25 Friends in Wichita. The Bulldogs of McPherson head to Texas to face Southwestern Assemblies of God University.

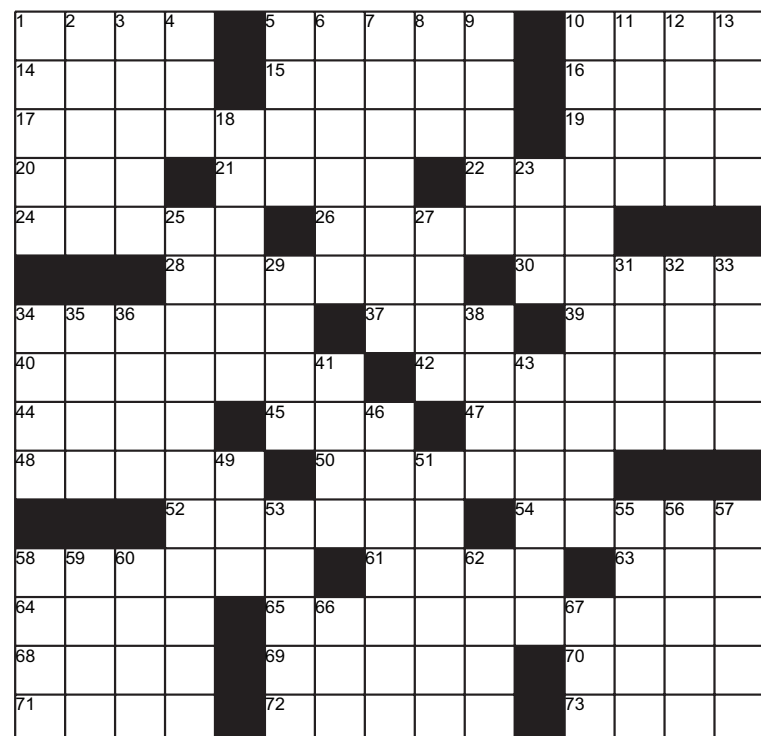
