Races for the 17th annual Flatlander Fall Classic gave fans more than 12 hours of high-speed action Friday and Saturday on the dirt track at the Sherman County

Track conditions were great Friday night, with 122 cars entered. A cold north wind on Saturday brought the number down to 119.

Alex West, president of the Sherman County Racing Association, said the car numbers were down a bit and the cold on Saturday reduced the grandstand crowd. West said the record for one night of racing is about 130 cars, but he was pleased with the turnout.

West said the attendance money for the two days was about \$4,000 to \$5,000 less than last year, and that will make it harder to pay all the

West said there were quite a few accidents that slowed the races down this weekend, but he thought the track was rougher on Friday after the rain Thursday.
