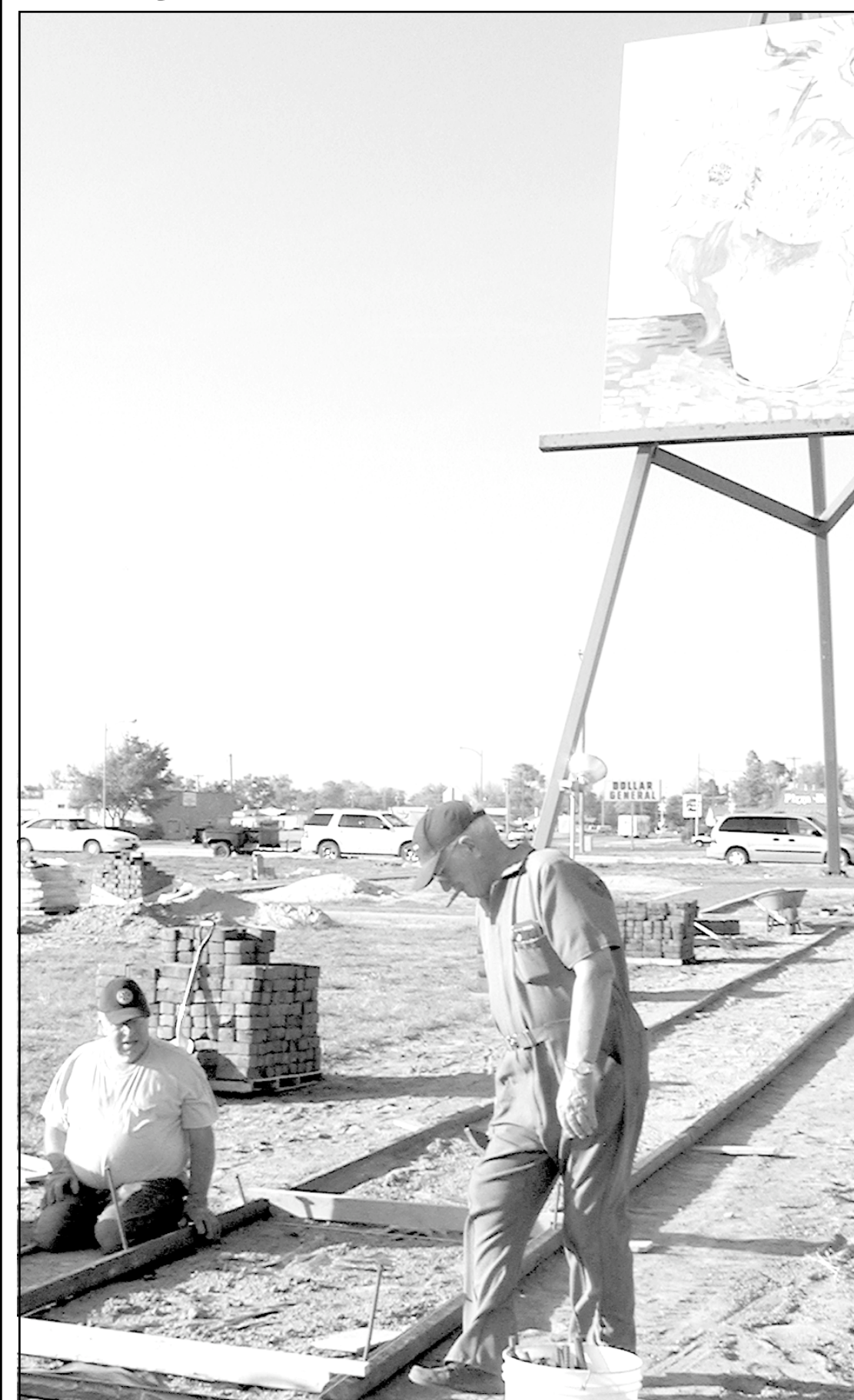


Adding more sidewalk

Lady Tigers place third at Fort Hays State meet

Colby native Zanae Baird finished 28th out of 97 runners at the Tiger Open cross country meet last Saturday at Fort Hays State University helping the Lady Tigers place third.

Baird, a 2006 graduate of Colby High, ran the 5,000-meter course in 20 minutes 11.87 seconds. Her teammate junior Katie Kersenbrock, an Oakley High School graduate, finished 51st in 21:13.02.

Betty Rotich, a freshman at Colby Community College, won the race in 17:29.44. Kalie Smith, a 2006 graduate of Sharon Springs High, also ran for the Lady Trojans finished 71st in 23:08.33.

Butler County Community Col-

lege won the women's team title with Colorado College second. The U.S. Air Force Academy's "B" team took the men's title with Colorado College second and Fort Hays State third.

The next meet for the Tiger runners will be the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association championships on Saturday, Oct. 21, at Southwest Baptist University in Bolivar, Mo.

Lady Bulldogs win two at Hoxie

The fifth-ranked Brewster Lady Bulldogs won matches over Hoxie and Rawlins County at a tri-meet Tuesday at Hoxie.

The Lady Bulldogs slipped from third to fifth in the Class 1A rankings after losing to top-ranked Class 3A Oberlin and non-ranked Class 4A Goodland last week.

At Hoxie the Lady Bulldogs defeated Hoxie 25-11 and 25-18. They beat Rawlins County in two close games, 25-22 and 25-20.

"We played well throughout both

matches," said Coach Lynda McKee. "We showed great teamwork and tremendous hustle."

"As a team we served with 97 percent accuracy and hit with 87 percent accuracy."

Dani Bedore led the team with 25 kills, Avery Schultz had 8, Sarah Flanders, 4 and Megan Allen, 3. Audrey Hoyt had 29 assists.

Bedore was the top server with six aces and 15 points, Hoyt had 23 points, Allen had two aces and 22 points and Schultz had one ace and

22 points.

The leading blockers were Schultz, 4 and Bedore, 3.

The Lady Bulldogs record is 25-3, and the Western Kansas Liberty League tournament is at Sharon Springs on Saturday.

The Lady Bulldog Junior Varsity won both matches beating Hoxie 25-19 and 25-14 and beating Rawlins County 25-16 and 25-14.

"The junior varsity ended their season with an outstanding record of 18-1," McKee said.

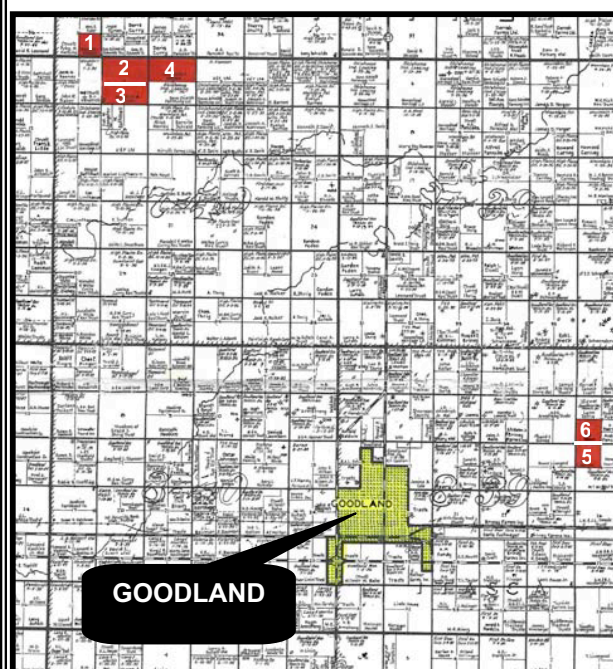

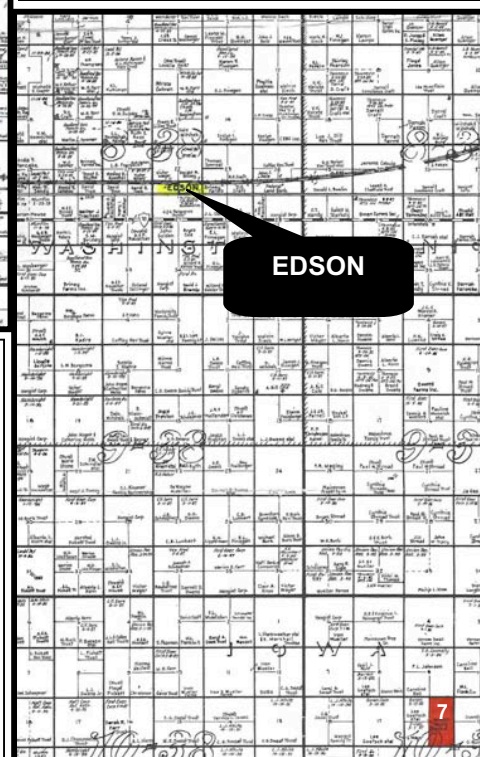
