

# Deer cause accidents

Two vehicles, too close to the center of the road, caused an accident on Dec. 1 when a 1997 Ford F250 pickup driven by Dannel L. Porter, 37, Norton, met a 1991 Buick LeSabre driven by Alice M. Evans, 46, Norton, at the crest of a hill on Norton County Road S. A Norton County sheriff's report said that Ms. Evans lost control of the westbound LeSabre and the vehicle went into the north ditch. No injuries occurred, and both drivers were wearing their seat belts.

Property damages to both cars were estimated to be over \$500.

Another non-injury accident occurred on Dec. 3 on U.S. 36 when a deer jumped from the north ditch and struck a westbound 1996 Cadillac Seville, driven by Diann D. Hofschulte, 69, of Pueblo West, Colo.

On Dec. 6, Teresa L. Reves, 49, Norcatur, was driving a 2001 Ford Taurus south on U.S. 283 when a deer came out of the west ditch and struck the vehicle. Damages to the Taurus were over \$500. Ms. Reves was wearing her seat belt.

A deer caused another accident on County Road W-6 when the animal jumped from the ditch and struck a southbound 2002 Ford F-150 pickup driven by Dennis C. McMullen, 64, Norton. Mr. McMullen was wearing his seat belt and was not injured. Damages to the pickup were over \$500.

On Dec. 7 Anthony Mark VanPatten, 24, Almena, lost control of his vehicle on County Road E-7. Mr. VanPatten was backing a 1991 Ford Explorer when he lost control of the vehicle and swerved into the east ditch. He was wearing his seat belt. Damages were over \$500.

On Dec. 7 a deer caused another accident when Marjorie Richard, 41, Edmond, was traveling south on U.S. 283 and the 1997 Chrysler LHS she was driving was unable to avoid hitting the animal. Ms. Richard was wearing her seat belt and was not injured. Damages to the Chrysler were over \$500.

On Dec. 9, Kurt J. Unterseher, 21, Lexington, Neb., hit a deer while driving his 2000 Ford Ranger north on K-383. The animal jumped from the east ditch and caused over \$500 damages to the
