Coach Doug Reusink hopes his 5-1 Norton Community High School boys basketball team learned a valuable lesson in their 53-49 Mid-Continent League win over Osborne on Tuesday in

After leading 11-6 at the end of the first quarter and 26-22 at halftime, the Blue Jays received deadeye shooting in the third period from senior forward Dan Roeder and senior center Jered Sloan. Roeder buried a trey and two twonets on three baskets as the Jays rolled up a 39-24 lead. The Bulldogs didn't fold, however, and came back with two treys late in the quarter to make it a 39-30 game with one period remaining. Junior forward Ryan Maddy got two key buckets to start the final stanza and points, however, to make a 43-38 game.
