Wanda A. Kimbrell, 83, of Topeka, died at her home on Jan. 28, 2004. Miss Kimbrell was born July 18, 1920 at Idalou, Texas, the daughter of Walter E. and Lessie (Bowers) Kimbrell. She was raised by her step-mother, Glessie Kimbrell. She received her bachelor's degree in home economics from Texas Tech University and her master's degree at the University of Denver in social work. Miss Kimbrell was baptized in Idalou and attended the First Church of the Nazarene in Topeka and later Elmont United Methodist Church. She was engaged to Lyman "Squirrely" McGhee when he died after his plane was shot down during World War II. Miss Kimbrell served as a county agent in Deaf Smith County in north Texas. She lived in Norton for more than 18 years before moving to Topeka in 1966. In Topeka, she worked in the administration of the Department of

Social and Rehabilitation Services, retiring in 1986. She was Director of Personnel and Staff Development. She was also active in Willowood Partners. She was preceded in death by her foster son, Michael Hahn, last November. Survivors include two house mates, Audrey Miller and Katie Klassen of Topeka; her brothers, John Gregory of Idalou; Guston and Garland Kimbrell, both of Lubbock, Texas; two sisters, Lillian Base of Idalou; and Nellie Herd of Lubbock. Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m., Saturday, Feb. 1 at Davidson Funeral Home, Topeka. Burial will be in the Idalou Cemetery with White Funeral Home in Idalou handling the Texas arrangements. Foundation offers career scholarships
