Applicants must be involved in at least 12 school activities in three different areas. Applicants must also accumulate at least eight community service activities.


Jason Jones, Norton Community High School English teacher, spoke to the members, student body, parents and friends on the

# Ambulance hits hospital garage door

The Norton ambulance backed into a garage door at the hospital last month.

On Feb. 23 the driver of the Norton County ambulance, Teresa J. Hartzog, did not notice that the garage door at the Norton County Hospital was not completely open as she backed into the garage.

The ambulance struck the doors, causing \$1,800 in damages. Passengers in the ambulance were emergency medical technicians Beth Horney, Andy Nielsen and a patient. No one was injured in the accident.

Authorities said that sometimes the door is opened by ambulance attendants and sometimes by people at the hospital. They thought that, in this case, both parties tried to open the door and only succeeded in making it go partially up.

The police responded to an accident on March 6 in the 300 block of North Graves. The police report

said Rebecca L. Brakey, 50, Leoti, was driving a 1993 Buick LeSabre south on Graves when her vehicle struck a parked 1996 Chevrolet Cavalier registered to Gohl Delynn of Wallace, Neb., as she was attempting to park.

Both vehicles sustained over \$500 in damages. No one was injured.

On March 19, the Norton County Sheriff's Department responded to a one-vehicle, injury accident on the Lower Dam Road at the Sebelius Lake.

Craig A. Eveleigh, 19, Norton, was driving a 2000 Pontiac Sunfire west on the road when he lost control and went into the north ditch, rolling the vehicle. Mr. Eveleigh and two passengers Jacob R. Hickman, 19, and Stephanie N. Ryan, 19, both of Norton, were taken to the Norton County Hospital. None of the occupants were wearing their seat belts.

# Commodity loans available

Farmers who still have an interest in their 2003-wheat, oats or barley can get a commodity loan until March 31, says Bill Fuller, state executive director of the U.S. Farm Service Agency.

"Nine-month loans are available for farm-stored or warehouse stored 2003 commodities," he said. "Loans obtained in March will be at 2.25 percent interest.

Farm-stored commodities must be in approved structures that meet the Kansas farm-stored loan policies."

March 31 also is the final date to request a loan deficiency payment on 2003-crop wheat, oats and barley. However, the market price of these commodities has been higher than the posted county price.
