# State-championship wrestling team honored

The 2003-'04 Class 3-2-1A State Champion Norton Community High School Wrestling Team was honored during the Wrestling Banquet April 18 at the American Legion Hall in Norton.

The Blue Jay wrestlers put together a tremendous season to win their first state title in Coach Bill Johnson's 13 years at Norton and the first since the 1973 team.

En route to the state championship, Norton compiled a perfect 16-0 dual record and won six of seven regular season tournaments. The Blue Jays placed fourth in the Newton Tournament of Champions, considered to be the toughest tournament in the state.

The Mid-Continent League champion Blue Jays placed second to favored and defending state champion Hoxie in the regional tournament but defeated the Indians in exciting fashion in the state tournament the next week in Hays. The state tournament will be remembered as one of the most exciting in history. The team title came down to the final 275 pound match and junior Michael Sprigg came through with an overtime win to secure the state champion-


Placing in the state tournament for Norton were: freshman Kent Mann, 103, fifth; sophomore Clay Madden, 112, first; freshman Nathan Broeckelman, 119, second; senior James Annon, 130. first; sophomore Lance Roe, 135, fourth; senior Scott Goldsby, 140, second; senior Jordon Haussermann, 152, third; senior Bo Pfannenstiel, 171, fifth; junior Michael Sprigg, 275, first.

Senior Curtis Black, 125, competed at state and scored valuable points that helped the Blue Jays win the championship.

Following a potluck meal, Coach Johnson spoke to the wrestlers, parents and fans and presented a number of awards. Winning the "Most Outstanding Wrestler" Award was senior James Annon, a two-time state champion and three-year state medalist who compiled a 35-2 season record.
