Mr. Hover told the group that the State Federal Fund percentage of the Parks Division operating budget has gone from 60 percent of the total budget approximately 20 year ago, down to 18 percent during the current year. The department has been notified that continued cuts in the general fund are planned and this funding will be eliminated by 2006.

In other words, the parks division must become nearly self-supporting in the future. This is very unfortunate since the \$1.2 million in state general funds has helped the state parks generate a \$658 million economic impact to the State of Kansas.

Several options are being researched and changes in the permit fee structure are inevi-
