Six members of the Northern Valley track team qualified for state at the 1A Regional Track Meet on May 21 in Hays. The state meet is being held today and tomorrow at Cessna Stadium in Wichita.

The Husky boys placed fifth at regionals with 40 points, while the girls took 11th with 19 points.

Qualifying for the state meet were: Joey Copper — 110 meter high hurdles, first place, 16.0; and triple jump, fourth, 41' 1/2"; Jesse Hilburn — 300 meter intermediate hurdles, third, 43.10; and high jump, fourth, 6' 2"; Avery Thalheim — javelin, second, 163' 3"; Clarke Nelson — pole vault, third, 11'; Lindsey Graham

— discus, second, 101' 8"; Kelli Cole — high jump, second, 4' 10".

Hilburn placed fifth in the 110 meter high hurdles at 17.30, but didn't qualify. Jessie Redeker also placed but didn't qualify, taking fifth in the 200 meter dash at 29.10 and sixth in the 100 meter dash at 13.80.

Also placing for the Trojan men was the 4 x 800 meter relay team of Tanner Pabst, Kevin Burge, Kyle Brobst and Kevin Pinkerton. They ran a season best of 9:25.20,

which earned them fifth place, missing qualifying for state by 3.5 seconds.

Placing, but not qualifying, were Jenny Noel, sixth in the javelin at 100' 5"; and the 4 x 400 meter relay team of Hartman, Clements, Jackson and Webb, who came in fifth at 4:26.80.
