# Requirements have changed for government commodities

Changes have been made in the income requirements for persons to receive government surplus commodities.

To be eligible for commodities, your household's total monthly income must be below: \$1,009 for a single person; \$1,354 for a family of two; \$1,698 for a family of three; \$2,043 for a family of four; \$2,387 for a family of five; \$2,732 for a family of six; \$3,076 for a family of seven; \$3,421 for a family of eight; add \$345 for each additional person.

Commodities distributed this month in Norton County include beef stew, dried plums, fruit and

nut trail mix, peaches, raisins and vanilla pudding.

Distribution dates and times are: 2-3 p.m. Tuesday at the Lenora Senior Center; 9-11 a.m. Wednesday at the Almena Senior Center; 2-4 p.m. Wednesday at the Norton Senior Center; and 2:30-3:30 p.m., Saturday, Aug. 21, at the Clayton Library.
