Marvin L. Keener, 88, died Aug. 8 at St. John Hospice, Lakewood, Colo. Mr. Keener was born Nov. 21, 1915, at the home of his great-grandfather in Norcatour. On July 4, 1948, he married Olive Paschal at Stoneham, Colo. Mr. Keener owned and operated a paint spraying business in Greeley until Dec. 1948, when the family moved to Denver. He was a civilian mechanic at Lowry Air Force Base during World War II, repairing planes coming from Europe. He later went to Kersey, Colo., and worked at the Henry Dairy until the end of the war. He returned to Denver where he worked for the Denver Dry Wall Co. as a sheet rock finisher for 29 years. He was

retired for 25 years. Survivors include his wife of 56 years, Olive, Golden, Colo.; two daughters, Jan and John LaMaster, Golden and Marla Wells, Denver. Mr. Keener was a cousin of Imogene (Hager) Hoyt, Norton. Funeral services were held at the Golden Nazarene Church, with Pastor Joe Gorman officiating. Margaret Dodson accompanied soloist, John Hays.
