

JUST DARNED GOOD COOKIES

1 cup white sugar
1 cup brown sugar
1 cup real butter
1 cup vegetable oil
1 egg
2 teaspoons real vanilla
1/2 teaspoon black walnut extract
1/2 teaspoon coconut extract
1 teaspoon burnt sugar extract
3 1/2 cups flour
1 teaspoon cream of tartar
1 teaspoon soda
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup of crisp rice cereal
1 cup chopped nuts
1 cup old fashioned oats
1 cup coconut

Mix ingredients in the order given, shape into balls, dip bottom of glass in sugar and flatten balls on cookie sheet. Bake at 350 F for 10-12 minutes. Makes 100 cookies and you'll need every one — these melt away like snow in July.
