




Crafts fair draws crowd

The Dane G. Hansen Memorial Museum, Logan, will host a three-day painting workshop with master pastelist, Kaye Franklin.

Ms. Franklin instructed an oil and pastel class at the museum last fall and has been asked to return. She began her art career in 1975, while living in Pagosa Springs, Colo. She and her family moved to Graham, Texas, in 1979.

She studied at the Scottsdale Artist School and with Connecticut artist William Henry Earle.

She has received many national awards and honors. She has taught in Canada, Mexico, England, France, Spain, Italy and the Pacific Northwest. She has been featured in American Artists magazine and

Best Pastels.

The elements in her artwork consist of light, color and focal point. She likes working with both pastels and oils. Pastels show immediate results and they stay brilliant; oils allow you to create new colors from existing pigments. Instruction will be in both on varied subjects. Classes will be held on Thursday-Saturday, Oct. 28-30, at the Hansen Plaza Community Room, 110 West Main, Logan. The course is for intermediate to advanced artists.

The museum is open from 9 a.m.-noon, and 1-4 p.m., Monday-Friday. Saturday hours are 9 a.m.-noon and 1-5 p.m. Sundays and holidays the museum is open 1-5 p.m..
