"Steals were picked off by Bozarth, KaraJo Jones and Baird with 4 each, while Paxton and Rossi both took 3.

"If you will notice, these are team highs — again they find ways.

"Rebounding — one key stat — WaKeeney only had five offensive rebounds!! This kept them from having easy putbacks, which would have added to their total. The reason — great positioning on rebounding and just all out hustle on the Blue Jays part. Leading rebounders were Jones and Bozarth, 11 each; followed by Paxton, 8. Oh yes, of our 34 team rebounds, 22 were offensive.

"Assists were handed out by Rossi with 4 and Baird and Jones with 2 each.

"A good effort and a good lesson for the younger players to learn is that you can come out on top even without your best offensive game. Just play your hardest on defense and rebounding and you will always have a chance."

"Assist leader was Foley, who found 3 teammates open for scores."

Scoring for the Lady Jay junior varsity were Delimont, 9 points; Thomson, 6; Engelbert and Eagleburger, 2 apiece.

Rebounding honors went to Hamel, 5; Keiswetter, 4; Herman, 3; Gall, 2; Lewis and Adam Myers, 1 each.


Steals were made by Keiswetter and Hamel, 4 apiece; Gall, 3; Myers, Connor Pfannenstiel, and Herman, 1 each.
