

# Northern Valley boys beat Bertrand; record now 3-3

The Northern Valley boys basketball team upped their pre-winter break record to 3-3 when they defeated Bertrand, Neb., 52-44 on Friday.

"After having scored 69 points against Smith Center, we knew we wanted to continue to aggressively push the ball and put pressure on the defense to get back," said Coach Jason Dibble. "We again did a good job of pushing the ball, but sometimes we took a quick early shot from the perimeter rather than forcing the defense to give us a better opportunity.

"In the second quarter we started doing this better and it resulted in a 30-17 halftime lead, part of which was the result of finding Joey in a lot of one-on-one situations, getting to the freethrow line and converting, and only having three turnovers in the first half.

"In the second half we did not do as good a job with their pressure and committed 12 turnovers, but continued to be persistent and aggressive on offense allowing us to continue to go to the freethrow line. Anytime you can go to Nebraska and go to the freethrow line 28 times, you are definitely earning the foul shots.

"It felt good to get a win and push us to 3-2, ensuring our goal of 3-3 before Christmas, but if we learned anything it is that when you have a team down we need to put them away. Bertrand did a nice job of playing hard to the end, but we also did a good job by holding off their run when they made one. Our last game against Brewster will definitely be our toughest test of the year, but I think we will be up to the challenge."

Joey Copper led scoring for the Huskies with 32 points. He was followed by Henry Griffiths, 7; Avery Thalheim, 6; Andrew Sheley, 4; and Jesse Hilburn, 3.

Rebounding honors went to Copper with 10; Thalheim, seven; Cole Kinderknecht, Griffiths and Sheley, three each; and Hilburn, two.

Hilburn led steals with 5, while Kinderknecht, Griffiths, Copper and Sheley each made 1.

Assists were made by Hilburn and Thalheim, three each; Griffiths, two; Kinderknecht and Copper, one each.

Griffiths made two blocks and Copper made one.

The junior varsity lost 42-15.

"Any time you go to Nebraska you have to be prepared for contact and pressure," said the coach. "In the first half, we handled it well enough and played good enough defense to give ourselves a chance only being down 15-9 at half. We talked about needing to give ourselves some more scoring opportunities by executing our offense.

"In the second half, they continued to pressure us and we again were unable to respond in a positive manner. The players' effort has not been an issue the last couple of games, but sometimes we do not make good decisions. We let other teams be aggressive toward us but do not always play aggressively at them.

"One thing to becoming better ball handlers is being able to go

right or left and after working on this in practice this week we definitely saw improvement in our willingness to dribble with our left hand. The players need to just keep working hard and improvement will be shown as the season continues on, especially when we hit our league teams."

Rebounding honors went to Sheley with five; Harris, four; Nelson, three; Cody Lowry, two; Chase Miller, Marble and Chance Miller, one each.

Making steals were Marble, two; Harris, Lowry and Nelson, one each.

Harris and Scott Shearer both made one assist.
