Seventh-grade girls win tournament

The Norton Junior High School seventh-grade girls defeated Smith Center and Belleville to win the Smith Center tournament on Dec. 11.

In the first game against Smith Center, Ashlie Stewart led the way to the 28-13 victory by scoring 10 points, which is also her average scoring per game. Post players Lacy Keilig and Kaitlyn Wolf each added 4 points to the cause.

Other Blue Jay scorers included Shelby Jones, who scored a 3-point basket; Hannah Waggoner, 2 points; Amanda Ray, 2; and Alyssa Thomson, 1.

"That was a good victory to start off the tournament," said Coach Kim Pakkebieb. "The full court pressure we put on Smith Center really helped us take control of the game."

In the second game, The Blue Jays faced off with the Buffs from Belleville. The Jays had no problem claiming a 38-11 victory.

Ray's 11 point effort really got things going. Nine of those 11 points came in the first quarter of play.

Jones hit another 3-point shot in this game. She had 5 total points in this game while Bethany Winkler also had 5. Waggoner and Wolf each scored 4. Kendra Engelbert put in 3. Those scoring 2 points included Stewart and Keilig. Thomson and Steph Eagleburger both had 1.

"The tournament victories were great successes for this team," said the coach. "The entire team made important contributions, and I think everyone did a great job."

Eighth-grade girls add another win

The Norton Junior High School eighth-grade girls added another victory to their record, defeating the Ellis Streamliners 32-22 on Dec. 9.

"The Streamliners came rolling into town for a very important league game and it turned out to be all it was played up to be as we won a hard fought contest by the score of 32-22 to give the defending champions a loss," said Coach Chuck Zimmerman.

"As has been our forte this entire season, defense led the way as we recognized their strengths and worked to control them.

"Our deflect leaders were Laura Lee Baird with 4, while Taylor Rossi and KaraJo Jones each tipped 3.

"Steals were taken by Baird with 7 and Rossi, Hones and Hayli Bozarth with 2 apiece.

"Rebounds, the final step to any defensive stand played a huge key in this victory as we did not allow Ellis any offensive rebounds and only 7 defensive. Our rebounding leaders were Baird, 7; Ashley Colip, Wiyanna Paxton, Jones and

Bozarth, all with 3. "Assists were handed out by Baird, 6; and Rossi, 3."

Scoring for the Lady Jays were Baird, 8 points; Paxton, Jones and Bozarth, 6 each; Rossi, 4; and Colip, 2.

"Our junior varsity kept with their winning ways as they defeated the Streamliners 23-6 as they created 36 turnovers with their defense," said Coach Zimmerman.

"Deflects leaders were Hannah Fulton with 7, followed by Kendra Engelbert with 5. Steal leaders were Engelbert with 5 and Fulton with 4, while Amanda Delimont and Beth Winkler each took 3.

"Rebounding honors went to Delimont with 5, followed by Raven Brown with 4.

Scoring for Norton were Alyssa Thomson, 6 points; Kayla Foley and Delimont, 4 apiece; Brown, Engelbert and Emily Juenemann, 2 each.
