

Huskies lose one win one

The Northern Valley High School junior varsity basketball team has taken one loss and gained one win at the Hill City C-team Tournament Tuesday and Wednesday.

The Huskies were beaten by Phillipsburg 50-45, but then came back the next day to defeat Oberlin 60-44.

"We were up 12 points at half-time," said Coach Jason Dibble. "We played pretty good until the second half, when they started putting pressure on us and we were turning the ball over."

"We led most of the game and were in a position to win, but weren't able to close the deal. We did see some improvement in this game."

"One thing of note is that of Phillipsburg's 50 points, one player scored 20 points and another took 21. So, if we could have shut them down, we would have been good."

David Harris led scoring for Northern Valley with 17 points, followed by Bryce Marble, 10 points; Chase Miller, 9; Richie Kersch, 5; Blake Johnson, 2; and Chance Miller, 2.

Harris, Marble and Kersch each made six rebounds.

"This game was similar to Phillipsburg," he said. "We came out and got the lead in the first half, but then in the third we let them back into the game. In the fourth, we were able to pick it up and really play a good game, outscoring them 20-8."

played Plainville at 5:30 p.m. In the loser's bracket, Northern Valley and Oberlin played at 1 p.m. and Osborne played Quinter at 2:30 p.m.

The schedule for today is seventh place, 11 a.m.; fifth place, 12:30; third place, 2 p.m.; and championship, 3:30.

In the win over Quinter, Norton held quarter leads of 22-10, 31-22 and 43-28.

Four Norton players scored in double figures. Wes Georgeson was the leader with 20, followed
