Get chemotherapy tips for patients and families

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention estimate that about 1.4 million new cases of cancer were found last year.

The diagnoses vary, but cancer patients, their families and close friends who will support them through the illness and treatment process experience many of the same concerns.

Many will have little if any exchemical treatment formulated to treat a specific cancer.

As treatment is planned, there Caregivers often is time for a patient to put together a team of helpers and develop a plan to share responsibilities. If the primary caregiver is nervous about traffic on the way to a city medical center, others can be asked to drive.

Help running errands, doing laundry, cooking and housekeeping usually are needed, as are offers to sit with the patient to give the primary caregiver time off.

The treatment process and side effects, including weakness, nausea, loss of appetite, a change in skin, nails and dental health, and hair loss, can be unsettling. Side effects from chemotherapy typically subside when the treatments

• Learn as much as you can about the kind of cancer being treated. Ask the physician and oncologist for information to take home to read, and check the public library, health department and local chapter of the American Cancer Society for more information about the illness, as well as resources and support groups avail-
