Adult children often fail to pick up on signs that their parents are aging. Many ignore the obvious, be it gray hair, an occasional lapse in memory or diminishing energy. So what's a family to do? Here

are some tips given at the expo: • Talk about aging. Be observant

- and ask questions, but respect each other's dignity and privacy. Be interested, but not intrusive.
- Encourage parents to have regular medical checkups, and volunteer to accompany them, if you can.
- Encourage older parents to make a list of medications that they are taking and to carry it with them.
- Encourage brain exercise through conversation, reading, word, card or other games, social
- or volunteer activity, community service or a hobby club. • Encourage physical activity go for a walk or work in the garden together and explore neigh-

> • Keep in touch with telephone calls, e-mail, or both, if distance or scheduling make it difficult to visit regularly.

> • Help make the home safe and accessible. Adjustments in the home may mean adults can stay in their home longer. Something as simple as removing scatter rugs, installing grab bars by the toilet or tub, or adding night lights typically improves safety in the home.

> Little changes may not seem like much, but they may be just enough to make it possible for older adults to stay in their own home and retain their independence longer.

> The inter-generational process in which adult children move into the role of care givers for aging parents is a transition that can provide a lesson for the whole family. Children who see their parents caring for their grandparents usually learn respect for the aging process, their parents, and their grandparents as well.
