

# Winners catch 56 carp in derby



A scorching sun and temperatures of over 100 degrees didn't stop the 22 two-person teams who competed in the 25th annual Busch Carp Derby Saturday and Sunday at Sebelius Reservoir.

The 44 people fishing this weekend managed to bring in a total of 508 carp. The top ten teams who snagged the most fish received cash prizes, while the top three got the cash and trophies.

Curtis Glenn and J.D. Sanderson, Norton, finally managed to break out of second place to take the win with 56 carp. The team took home \$150 for taking first place.

Coming in second place were John Baker and Justin Baker, Norton. Baker and Baker brought in 52 carp for a prize of \$100.

Garry Staab and Wade Ditter, Hays, brought in 49 carp for third place and \$75.

Others in the top ten were Mike and Mona Coffey, Norton, 44 carp, fourth place, \$70; Tim and Cindy Rabe, Bucklin, 43, fifth, \$65; Phil Buford and Rex Buford, Colby, 37, sixth, \$60; Gary Williams and Reggie Beckman, Norton, 35, seventh, \$55; Dean Wiseman and Lucas Wiseman, Norton, 32, eighth, \$50; Michael and Amy Coffey, Norton, 25, ninth, \$45; and Raymond Wait, Norton, and Kaid Evans, Oberlin, 24, tenth, \$40.

Mike and Mona Coffey brought in the largest fish on Saturday at 10 1/4 pounds. On Sunday, the team of Williams and Beckman brought in the largest fish, which weighed 11 pounds. Both teams received \$50 from First Security Bank and Trust.

## Division II boys play final games

The Division II boys baseball teams ended their season on June 29, but played one last game on June 30 from a rain postponement on June 3.

### Engel's/NAPA 9, Nex-Tech 8

On June 22, neither team scored until the second inning. Nex-Tech was up first with runs from Jared Bohl, Brett Pulec and Cody Ellis. Tye Nickell, Zane Miller and Damien Davis rounded the bases for Engel's in the bottom.

Nex-Tech took the lead in the third after Trey Millan, Joe LeClair, R.J. Ellis, Bohl, and C. Ellis all crossed home base. But, Engel's evened the tally with five more runs from Casey Temmel, Carson McKenna, Gunnar Hays, Nickell, and Daniel Lentz.

In the fourth, Engel's won the game with a final run from Temmel.

### Engel's/NAPA 5, Brooks Motel 3

Engel's took the lead right off the bat in the top of the first on June 24 with three from Temmel, Hays, and Nickell. Drew Ellis put Brooks on the board in the bottom of the inning.

The second brought another two to Engel's with Calen Bach and Temmel rounding the bases, while Taylor Meder and Michael Courtain both crossed home base for Brooks.

### Engel's/NAPA 10, Nex-Tech 9

Temmel, Davis, Kurt Douglas and Nickell gave Engel's the lead in the top of the first on June 28, with Lentz scoring in the second.

Nex-Tech made it on the board in the second with Ellis and Pulec scoring, and then took the lead in the third with runs from Millan, Bohl, Ellis, Pulec and Ryan Bainter.

Engel's got closer in the fourth with one from Miller, and then regained the lead in the fifth with Temmel, Davis, Nickell, and Hays crossing home base. Nex-Tech tried to get ahead again, but couldn't as only Ellis and Cody Campbell were able to round the bases.

### Engel's/NAPA 12, Brooks Motel 8

On June 29, Brooks begin the first with three runs from Dalton Miller, Seth Antrim and John Risewick. But, Engel's took the lead when Hays, Davis, Douglas and Nickell each scored.

The second brought a tied tally when Justin Waggoner crossed

home base for Brooks. In the third, John Risewick, John Renner, and Robert Blecha each added to the tally. Engel's gained back the lead though when Douglas, Nickell, Daniel Field, Miller, and Carson McKenna rounded the bases.

Brooks added one more to its tally in the fourth from Antrim, but Engel's widened the gap further with Davis, Douglas, and Field all scoring.

### Brooks Motel 10, Engel's/NAPA 4

Brooks jumped to a lead on June 30 with four in the second from Blecha, Courtain, Renner and Meder, and then widened the gap a bit more in the third when Blecha, Meder and Waggoner rounded the bases.

Engel's made it on the board in the bottom of the third with a single run from Zack Nelson.

The fourth was a one run inning for both teams as Risewick added to Brooks tally and McKenna scored for Engel's.

The fifth brought one more for Brooks from Courtain and two more for Engel's from Nickell and Field.
