

Legion nine to play in Zone Tourney

The Norton American Legion baseball team will open Zone Tournament play on Saturday versus Smith County in a 4 p.m. game in Osborne.

It will be a double elimination tournament. Norton will play two games on Saturday. If the Blue Jays win over Smith County, they will play at 8 p.m. and a loss would put them in a 6 p.m. contest.

The tournament will run through Monday with a possibility of a Tuesday championship contest.

Pre-tournament games

Norton competed in the Osborne Invitational Tournament on July 2-3-4.

In their first tournament game, the Blue Jays defeated Clifton-Clyde 7-3.

Norton took a 4-0 lead in the second inning. Jordan Durham and Denton Bailey both singled and Chris Davis doubled. Jared Foley, Jared Mindrup, Pat Burton and Aaron Daniels singled. Bailey, Davis, Foley and Mindrup all scored.

Clifton-Clyde scored a single run in the bottom of the third. Norton tallied once in the top of the fourth when Foley doubled and Burton singled him home to make it a 5-1 game.

The Blue Jays added another run in the top of the fifth when Corey Look blasted a home run! Davis singled later in the inning but did not score.

Clifton-Clyde added a run in the bottom of the inning to make it 6-2.

The Blue Jays scored their final run in the top of the sixth when Foley stepped to the plate and slammed a home run!

Clifton-Clyde scored their last run in the bottom of the inning when Sorrell hit a home run to make the final score 7-3.

Norton had 15 hits in the game. Six different Norton hitters had at least two hits. Foley was a perfect 3 for 3 at the plate. Burton and Bailey were both 2 for 3 and Look, Durham and Davis were 2 for 4.

Davis was the winning pitcher. He gave up eight hits, struck out 10 batters and walked seven.

Beeson was the losing pitcher. Norton played host team Osborne in their second tournament game and came away with a 13-4 loss.

Osborne took a 6-0 lead in the top of the first inning and added three runs in the top of the second. Norton scored one time in the bottom of the second. Brock McChesney tripled and Bailey singled him home.

Three more Osborne runs in the top of the third extended their lead to 12-1.

The Bulldogs added one more run in the top of the fourth to make it a 13-1 game.

Norton's final three runs came in the bottom of the fourth. McChesney was hit by a pitch and walked, Bailey singled and Daniels walked. All three scored.

Norton had just four hits in the game. Bailey was leading hitter. He went 2 for 2.

Bailey was the losing pitcher. He gave up 15 hits, walked eight and struck out five batters.

Roach was the winning pitcher. Norton lost to Phillipsburg 7-4 in the Jays' final tournament game. Phillipsburg took a 6-0 lead with one run in the top of the first, four in the second and one in the third inning.

The Blue Jays tallied two runs in the bottom of the fourth to make it 6-2. Davis, Look and McChesney singled, Bailey doubled and Look and McChesney scored.

Phillipsburg scored once in the top of the fifth to make it 7-2.

Norton's last two runs came in the bottom of the sixth when Look singled, McChesney walked and both scored to make the final 7-4.

Norton had just five hits in the game. Look was leading hitter. He went 2 for 3 at the plate.

Rutherford was the losing pitcher. He was relieved in the second inning by Davis and Davis was relieved in the seventh inning by Bailey. Phillipsburg had 13 hits, walked 10 times and seven Panther batters struck out.

Merklein was the winning pitcher.

Split at Smith Center

Norton split a doubleheader against Smith County at Smith Center on July 11.

The Blue Jays lost a 15-14 heart-

breaker in the opener, then blasted the Redmen 14-2 in the nightcap.

Norton scored one run in the top of the first inning in the opening contest when Foley singled and made it home on a fly out by Bailey.

Smith County scored their first three runs in the bottom of the inning and added five more runs in the bottom of the second.

Norton did not score again until the top of the fourth when the Blue Jays ran across eight runs to take a 9-8 advantage. McChesney, Look, Durham, Davis and Logan Keiswetter all singled. Mindrup doubled, Foley singled and Bailey doubled. McChesney, Look, Durham, Davis, Keiswetter, Mindrup, Foley and Bailey all scored.

Two runs by the Redmen in the bottom of the inning gave them a 10-9 lead.

Norton regained the lead in the top of the fifth with two more runs when Davis singled and Keiswetter tripled him home.

Smith County took a 13-11 lead with three more runs in the bottom of the fifth.

Norton was scoreless in the top of the sixth and the Redmen added two more runs in the bottom of the inning to extend their lead to 15-11.

But, the Blue Jays weren't finished. They rallied in the top of the seventh and fell just one run short of tying the Redmen and possibly winning. Foley tripled, Rutherford walked and McChesney singled and all three scored to make the final 15-14 in favor of Smith County.

Norton had 16 hits in the game. Foley was the leading hitter, going 4 for 5 at the plate. Durham and Keiswetter were both 2 for 3 batting.

Rutherford was the losing pitcher. He was relieved in the second inning by Keiswetter and he was relieved in the fifth inning by Bailey. Smith County had 11 hits, 10 walks and seven Redmen struck out. Frank was the winning pitcher.

In the nightcap, Norton built a 5-0 lead in the first three innings. Foley walked in the top of the first and scored. Bailey doubled in the second and tallied. Foley and Daniels both singled, McChesney walked and Look singled and Foley, Daniels and McChesney scored in the top of the third.

The Blue Jays padded their lead

with nine runs in the top of the fourth. Mindrup singled, Rutherford doubled, Foley was hit by a pitch and walked, Keiswetter and Daniels both singled, Look tripled, Bailey and Davis both singled and Mindrup tripled. All of them scored to give Norton a 14-0 advantage.

The Redmen avoided a shutout by scoring two runs in the bottom of the fourth to make the final 14-2.

Norton had 13 hits in the contest. Foley went 2 for 2 at the plate and Daniels, Look, Bailey and Mindrup all went 2 for 3.

Davis was the winning pitcher. He hurled a three-hitter, walked no batters and struck out six.

Linn was the losing pitcher.

Doubleheader with Phillipsburg

The Norton Legion team played Phillipsburg in a doubleheader in Norton on July 14.

The Blue Jays took a narrow 6-5 loss in the opener.

The Panthers held a 1-0 lead after the top of the first and added four more runs in the top of the second to take a 5-0 lead.

The Blue Jays rallied in the bottom of the second with four runs to make it a 5-4 game. Bailey singled, Durham tripled, Davis and Foley both singled and all scored.

Phillipsburg added one run in the top of the third to make it 6-4. The Panthers did not score again but Norton was only able to tally one more run in the bottom of the fourth when Davis walked and scored to make the final 6-5 in favor of Phillipsburg.

Norton had just four hits in the game. Davis was 1 for 1 and Foley, Bailey and Durham were each 1 for 2 at the plate.

Mindrup was the losing pitcher. He gave up seven hits, walked seven and struck out two batters.

Cole was the winning pitcher. Norton suffered a 14-5 loss in the nightcap.

The Blue Jays took a 5-0 lead when Foley walked and scored in the first inning and McChesney, Mindrup and Ulmer walked, Foley doubled and Keiswetter singled and McChesney, Mindrup, Ulmer and Foley all scored in the second inning.

Phillipsburg tallied two runs in the top of the third to make it a 5-2 contest and took the lead for good with a 12 run barrage in the top of the fifth to make the final 14-5.

Eight of the Panthers' 14 hits came in the fifth stanza.

Norton recorded just three hits in the game. Foley, Keiswetter and McChesney each collected one hit.

Bailey started on the mound for Norton but was relieved in the fifth inning by Rutherford and Keiswetter.

Split at Phillipsburg

Norton got a measure of revenge on Monday of this week when the Blue Jays traveled to Phillipsburg and defeated the Panthers 13-10 in a doubleheader opener.

Norton scored two runs in the top of the first. Foley led off with a single, Bailey and Burton followed with doubles, Durham singled and Foley and Burton both tallied.

Phillipsburg tied the score with two runs of their own in the bottom of the inning.

Two more Norton runs in the top of the second made it a 4-2 game in favor of the Blue Jays. Davis singled to get on base and Foley hit a home run to bring home both runs.

Eight big runs in the top of the third by Norton pushed the Blue Jay lead to 12-2. Bailey singled and Burton slammed a home run to bring them both home. Then, Durham and McChesney both walked, Davis doubled, Mindrup singled, Rutherford tripled and Bailey walked and they all scored.

The Panthers closed the gap to 12-5 with three runs in the bottom of the third.

Norton added one run in the top of the fourth when Davis and Mindrup both singled and Davis tallied.

Phillipsburg scored another run in the bottom of the fourth to make the score 13-6.

Norton was scoreless in the top of the fifth. The Panthers rallied in the bottom of the inning but their four runs were too little, too late and the final score was 13-10 in favor of the visiting Blue Jays.
