### SPECIAL STAMPS OFFERED

The Norcatur Post Office has joined a nationwide effort to "stamp out" breast cancer, through sales of the Breast Cancer Research semipostal or fundraising stamp. "Circle of Hope" cards bearing the purchaser's name will be displayed at the post office. The 45-cent, self-adhesive stamps are valid for postage at the first class mail first-ounce letter rate of 37 cents, with the 8-cent differential, minus cost, going to the National Institutes of Health and the Medical Research Program at the Department of Defense. The differential is a tax-deductible contribution.
