

# Norton to play second district game tonight

The Norton Community High Blue Jays will travel to Russell tonight for the second District 10 playoff football game of the season.

Kickoff will be at 7 p.m. In the start of post-season play last Friday night, Norton shutout Thomas More Prep of Hays 21-0 and Russell lost to a strong 6-1 Phillipsburg team 47-13.

The Blue Jays are 5-2 with losses to state-ranked and unbeaten Smith Center and Oakley. Russell has a 2-5 record.

Matt Cook, a 6-foot, 2-inch, 185-pound junior quarterback, scored both touchdowns for Russell against Phillipsburg on runs of four yards in the first quarter and two in the fourth.


Russell scored first in the game and trailed by just 7-6 after the first quarter.

In beating Thomas More, Norton relied on a strong rushing game offensively and a stingy defense which allowed the Monarchs only 84 yards rushing and 19 passing. Norton limited Thomas More to a 2.5 yards per carry average in the rushing department.

Meanwhile, the Blue Jays gained 260 yards on the ground and 39 passing for 299 yards of offense. Junior tailback Blake VanEaton led the Norton rushing attack with 154 yards on 20 carries for a 7.7 yards per carry average.

"Our defense played well all night," Norton Coach Bruce Graber told the Blue Jay Booster Club on Wednesday evening.

"We didn't play very well up

front in the first half and our quarterback Luke Pfannenstiel was struggling. We challenged them at halftime and they did much better the second half.

"Russell has a better team than Thomas More. In watching them on film, you can see that they play as hard the last play of the game as they do the first.

"They run a ton of different

plays and give you many looks. Defensively, they run the same

defense as Ellis and we had trouble blocking it.

"We'll have our hands full on Friday night."

## Speedway tallies point standings

Schoenberger was the first non-Iowan to win the IMCA Stock Car Nationals in Boone, Iowa, this year, and Lariviere took second nationally in rookie points.

Rounding out the top ten in stock cars were J.R. McCreery, Stockton, 403; Kelly Ford, Phillipsburg, 401; Tyler Hahn, Stockton, 400; Cory Struckhoff, Kensington, 367; and Nathan Glendening, Stockton, 355.

Struckhoff was named the national IMCA Rookie of the Year.

Kelly Karnopp, Norton, topped the field in IMCA Hobby Stock with 454 points. VanEaton is leading Norton in all-purpose yards for the season. He has gained 526 yards rushing for a 6.3 yards per carry average, caught nine passes for 135 yards for a 15 yards per catch average and returned six kickoffs for 180 yards and a 30-yard average.

VanEaton has gained 841 yards in these three categories for an average of 120 yards per game in the seven contests played so far. He is also the scoring leader for Norton with 10 touchdowns.

Senior quarterback Pfannenstiel has completed 36 of 75 passes for a 48 percent completion rate and 533 yards. He averages 14.8 yards per completion. He also plays defensive back and leads the Blue Jays in takeaways. He has three fumble recoveries and two pass interceptions.

Leading tackler for Norton is senior linebacker Lance Roe with 38 solos and 18 assists. Second is VanEaton with 34 solos and 14 assists. Right behind is junior defensive back Nathan Broeckelman with 39 solos and eight assists.

District competition will be completed next Thursday when Norton plays Phillipsburg and Russell plays Thomas More Prep. The top two teams in the district will advance and play on Tuesday, Nov. 1 in bi-district contests.
