## Relay teams are being gathered



## Club talks about quilting

Quilting was the topic of the program heard by members of Beta Alpha Chapter of Delta Kappa Gamma Society International at their April 3 meeting. Judy Luft, Cheryl Roberts and Connie Miller shared samples of their projects. They belong to Heritage Quilter's Guild and have service projects they make with students at Northern Valley and Eisenhower classes. They are making lap robes for use at the Norton County Hospital.

Club members learned that the most famous quilters in early times were men. They viewed quilts of different styles, table runners and wall hangings. The "Underground Railroad" quilt has historical significance in the story of the slaves on the road to freedom in Canada by following the sym-

bols depicted in this quilt. The quilt is also known as "Jacob's Ladder".

In their lessons of making special designs, fabrics are being used that are reminiscent of the Civil War era or the Depression era. Those materials were from flour sacks or scraps of clothing sewn into quilts and comforters. Choosing colors that coordinate and best present the design are important facts. They are completing quilts for the quilt auction to be held on April 23.


