### NOTICE OF EXPLANATION

The City of Alma, Kansas, intends to make municipal water system improvements including the replacement of water well No. 5 with a battery of four water wells and a ground storage tank located 5 miles south of the city, the construction of 6" and 10" transmission line north to town, a chlorination station, the elimination of the existing storage tank on the south end of town, and the looping of existing water mains within the west end of the town from Pratt Avenue and County road south along County road to Mills Street, then east on to Mills Street to Sanborn Street. This project is needed to allow the city to comply with standards set by the Kansas Dept. of Health & Environment and Environmental Protection Agency. A portion of the project will be located in or through <1 acre of the 100 year floodplain. The project cannot be undertaken in any other location because of the land topography, the location of the ideal new water source and because the needed path must cross a tributary of Prairie Dog Creek. Therefore, there is not a practical alternative to the proposed project. The City considered the following alternatives:

- Blending existing sources of water
  - Obtaining quality water from another Source
  - Minimize the use or eliminate Well No. 5
  - Construct a water treatment plant
  - Obtain new source of raw water
- The proposed project is designed to minimize adverse impacts and preserve the natural floodplain. Failure to provide these improvements would result in the City's continued noncompliance with State and Federal water quality standards. A more detailed description of the project is available for citizen review at City Hall, 415 Main, Alma, KS 67622.
