In inexplicably good news from Washington, the Senate Appropriations Committee voted to provide a total of \$48 million for US Department of Agriculture's Value-Added Producer Grants.

This is the second year in a row that one house of Congress provided more than was authorized by the farm bill, though last year it was the House rather than the Senate talking.

Spending bills during tight budgetary times can be politically sensitive, so many believe that the process may not be completed until the lame duck session after the election. We hope that proves untrue. In fact, the political sensitivity of election season is a time when rural Americans have an for the future of rural America and being heard.

The Kansas Legislature passed issued to persons under the age of 21 to expire on their 21st birthday — on and after July 1, 2006.


Fees for all new drivers' licenses issued to persons under 21 will be \$20 for each class of license requested, as well as any applicable examination fees and photo fees.
