administrator and police chief present.

- Waived the formal first reading of Ordinance 1555, relating to municipal court costs. The ordinance establishes a \$25 warrant fee and increases the court costs by \$10. The state has increased the law enforcement training center fees from \$9 to \$19 per case and the increase in court costs will cover the increase from the state.
- Approved Rick Schwab's alley improvement agreement for the alley behind 813 N. Jones. He will pay the price of the hard surface materials and the city will provide the labor and will maintain the alley thereafter.
- Set a budget hearing for 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 15
- Waived the formal first reading of Ordinance 1554, allowing

for the building of private garages on single lots within the city. The Planning Commission reviewed the issue, held a public hearing and recommended that the city allow it.

• Heard from Councilman Kelly Gaer that Nex-Tech would like to use the city's water tower to put a cell phone transmitter on. Nex-Tech would pay the city \$300/month for a five year lease. They will also maintain all of the equipment they install there. City Attorney Karen Griffiths will review the agreement and compare it to surrounding communities.

• Bought land from Charles "Bud" Posson for a one-time payment of \$6,000. The land is adjacent to the land the power plant is on and is also next to land the city just bought. The city will pay for the legal fees and will have the

drainage fixed. The land will be surveyed and then annexed to the city.

• Paid a voluntary dues assessment of \$1,203.54 for the KMU's transmission fund. The dues will be used to pay the legal and engineering cost of important transmission interventions and projects. The motion passed 3-2 with Councilwomen Elaine Mann and Donna Foley and Mr. Gaer voting yes, and Mr. Briery and Councilman Jerry Jones voting no.

• Agreed to allow the monthly court reports to be turned in for the second council meeting of each month.

• Heard from Mr. Jones that he appreciated the city crews helping to set up the carnival rides.

• Paid bills in the amount of \$501,792.
