### The Golden Rule By Lew Van Der Wege

"In everything do to others as you would have them do to you; for this is the law and the prophets." (Matthew 7:12)

Most of us learned this teaching of Jesus as children. We also learned the consequences when we didn't take this wisdom seriously. It seems so simple yet so difficult. Humans usually give what we get and get what we give.

When someone hurls a hurtful word our way, we usually hurl one back. When we strike someone on the left cheek he usually hits us on the right. You know the pattern - hurt for hurt, blow for blow, eye for eye, tooth for tooth.

A friend of mine told me recently that the world is so complicated that this teaching of Jesus doesn't work anymore. He said we need to do it to others before they can do it to us. It is hard to argue in favor of the Golden Rule. I just hope forgiveness still works.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 329

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE APPLICATION FEE FOR BUILDING PERMITS IN THE CITY OF LENORA, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LENORA, KANSAS:

**Section One.** That Section 4-213 of the Code of the City of Lenora, Kansas, concerning the fee for building permit applications is amended by replacing the existing section in its entirety with the following provisions:  
"4-213. SAME; FEES. The fee herein

shall be paid to the City Clerk upon applying for a building permit and the same shall be credited to the General Operating Fund of the City."

**Section Two.** This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication in the official City newspaper.


