No Longer Alone

Teen Challenge of the Rocky Mountains sent the testimony to us that you are about to read. God works powerfully through this ministry to change lives for His glory. We have been given permission to share this true story about a girl who felt that she was once all alone but now walks in fellowship with her Savior and Lord. This high school student received Jesus Christ into her heart while attending New Hope House, another ministry of Teen Challenge working in Tooele, Utah.

On February 16, 2002 her brother caught this young lady as she was committing the sin of fornication with her boyfriend. Her brother immediately went and told their parents. Her parents grounded her from seeing her boyfriend and put her in a situation where they could more effectively give her proper guidance. She then threatened to move out. However, this did not change her heart or make her circumstances any better. She had for some time been producing fruit in her life that comes from a rebellious heart and it was becoming worse all the time. Her parents knew that their daughter needed to get where she could get some help, and fast. Less than a week later, her parents took her on a "surprise" trip.

As they drove up the driveway to New Hope House/Teen Challenge she remembered focusing on a big white house with a cross on the roof. She immediately hated everything she set her eyes on as she walked through the door. When her parents left her there, she cried and she hated them, too. She felt that they had betrayed her and she felt so alone. She wanted nothing to do with the people there

because they were a part of her parent's plan; therefore, she hated them too.

At New Hope House they always talked about God and she didn't want any part of it. As far as she was concerned He had ruined her life. God didn't seem loving to her and she felt that He only condemned people. She always questioned in her heart "How could God give me peace?" She would even tell God she hated Him and all she would hear back from Him and those around her was "I love you." She started asking herself questions like, "Is there something more than the usual 'Christian' life that she had observed growing up?" She knew there had to be more. Then one day she found her answer in one man, Jesus Christ.

After accepting Christ into her heart to be both Savior and Lord she began developing a personal relationship with Him. Over the past year and a half the Lord has changed her life. He has taken away her rebellion, anger and hatred and replaced it with respect, peace and love. She wrote, "He

has also given me a special gift and filled me with His Holy Spirit. He walks with me every step of the way. *I am no longer alone.* Not ever."

She is now in her senior year in high school and is making plans for college. She writes, "I love my parents, my life and especially my brother."

Too many try to find victory over sin by church attendance, religious observances and worldly solutions. None of these will help unless first Jesus is allowed in to change your heart. Jesus says, "So, if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." (John 8:36)

Rose Ann Miller, Social Service Designee, at the Andbe Home conducts a Tuesday Topic Reminiscence Session close to the evening meal and residents had good memories of the buildings that burned in July.

Irene Wray remembered the U. S. 36 Collectibles building being a furniture and undertaker business. Aileen Boxler recollected when it was the Brooks Grocery Store. Irene Wray commented that Mrs. Sanderson had a grocery store there later and that perhaps Safeway had been there for a while. A number of residents remembered the Archery Club as Bower Hardware Store with a wood floor. Rose Ann reminded the group that Montgomery Ward catalog store had also been there. Paul Ballinger had memories about shopping in the west building when it was NAPA Car Parts.

The discussion brought thoughts about other fires in the area. Joe Foland told about the shock to the community of Alma with the grocery store burned. Elma Yunt recalled when the Norton County Courthouse burned down. Her folks spoke about it often. Irene Wray shared about a fire at Horney's Electric, Humphrey's Shoe Store, Duckwalls and Western Auto. She

also shared about a dentist office upstairs in the area on North State Street when it burned. The Ben Franklin Store fire was recalled by Rose Ann Miller. Beth Mustoe responded about the more recent fire by the theatre that was once Wood Motor, Bennett Motor, the National Guard Building and the Thrift Shop that was last owned by City Motors.

It was so very interesting when the residents made a run to White Field Coffee House on Aug. 4, which is just across the street from the burn site. Renee Griffith, owner of the coffee house, shared pictures she took during the fire where a rainbow could be seen wrapping around their business. She expressed how anxious she felt watching the flames soar and hearing the roar of the fire. There was nothing else to do she said expect to pray that the coffee house would be spared. When they did return to the business everything was OK except for the windows! Renee said the owner of the building saw to replacing them right away.

This whole month, the Andbe Home van was busy taking residents by the burn site. All were amazed at the damage. Beth Mustoe summed it up pretty well when she said, "Lordie, Lordie, what a mess!"

Rose Ann and I hope you agree memories are a wonder! They recall the past along with the smell and look of things. What is more wonderful than that except when you were there!
