## Principal's home make the grade for Homes Tour

The home of Corey and Gail Roy will be one of four on the annual Homes Tour, sponsored by the Norton County Arts Council as part of its fall membership drive on Sunday, Sept. 24.

The Roys' bi-level home is on the east edge of Norton off U.S. 36. Members and potential members going to view the Roys' home will turn in the drive that is just west of Ruth's Antiques on the north side of the highway. Theirs is the tan and brick home on the south side of the drive.

The tour will mark the one-year anniversary since the Roys moved in. Mrs. Roy said they bought it from Bruce and Mary Poage and moved in exactly a year to the day of the open house. The Poages, she said, built it in 1980 and lived there until the Roys moved in.

Mr. Roy said they haven't done any major renovations and don't plan to. They did do a little light interior work, Mrs. Roy said, like painting and removing some wallpaper.

"The house was good from day one," Mr. Roy said. "It met all of our needs and we didn't really feel we needed to do anything."

The 2,900 square foot home has a main floor and a full-sized base-

ment. It has four bedrooms, three bathrooms, a kitchen, family room, dining room and living room. The downstairs area has one of the bedrooms and a bathroom, as well as a large family room, a store room, and a kitchenette area.

Mr. Roy said they chose this home because of the location.

"We love the location," he said. "It gives us a little bit of space out here, gives us room for the family."

Mrs. Roy said it also has a nice backyard and front deck.

"The landscaping is really a plus," she said.

The family room downstairs is where everyone spends most of their time, she said. A lot of evenings are also spent out on the front deck.

The view is also a plus, said Mr. Roy.

"The basement is very comfortable for all of us," he said. "And we all just like to spend as much time outside as we can."

One thing on the "list of things to do" is to buy a couch, he said.

"Our daughter says that we are the only American family without a couch," he said.

The Roys moved here from Colorado when Mr. Roy was hired as the principal at Eisenhower El-



ementary. Mrs. Roy also works at Eisenhower as a tutor. They have two daughters, Katharine and Bethany.
