He attended Norcatour schools and served in the U.S. Army during World War II, achieving the rank of Staff Sergeant. After his military service, he returned to Norcatour to farm.

On Aug. 10, 1941, he married Evelyn Frewen in Norton.

He was a farmer and a member of the Norcatour Christian Church.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife, Evelyn on Sept. 27, 2000; a brother, Elton

Sebaugh; and an infant sister, Genola Sebaugh.

HANSEN MUSEUM

Our current exhibit is "Sandzen and the New Land". This traveling exhibition presents the art of Birger Sandzen (1871-1954), the founding father of painting in Kansas. This exhibition represents works from the two collections of the Birger Sandzen Memorial Gallery in Lindsborg; the Birger Sandzen Memorial Foundation Collection of Art and the Margaret S. Greenough Trust Art Collection. The exhibition includes over 55 oil paintings, watercolors and prints. The work was produced during the years 1891 through 1950.

Life in the "New Land" for Birger Sandzen began more than 110 years ago, in 1894 at the age of 23, when he came to Kansas where herds of cattle grazed on the limestone hills and unpainted frame structures had only recently supplanted the sod houses. Mr. Sandzen did not emigrate to America for economic reasons. He intended to stay only two or three years and then return to Sweden. Thousands of miles from his native Sweden he began an adventure as a painter that would span two World Wars and the Great Depression. His life as a teacher at Bethany College in Lindsborg, from 1894 to 1946 represents more than 52 years as an instructor in Spanish, French, art and assisting in vocal music for ten years. His marriage in 1900 to Alfrida Ledsell from McPherson, and the birth of his daughter and

only child, Margaret, in 1909 brought great joy to his life. "I have studied several languages but I do not believe all of them are enough to express the depth of my gratitude to Frida and Margaret," he said.

Charlotte and Eric Ledsell, Mrs. Sandzen's parents, moved to Graham County in 1906. They settled on a farm near Bogue west of Hill City. Wild Horse Creek flowed across a corner of their farm. The creek and surrounding area became the subject of many paintings, prints and watercolors by Mr. Sandzen. In the mid 1920s a tenant farmer took over the farm and the Ledsells moved to Lindsborg. Frequent visits to the farm by Mr. Sandzen and his family, even after the Leksells moved, allowed for sketching and painting of landscapes with outcroppings of limestone. Wild Horse Creek and rolling hillsides. In the years that followed, the family continued to visit the farm regularly. For him, and later his daughter, the trips provided an opportunity to sketch and paint Graham County.
