Tasty 'tater mounds too good to be left out

Cook's Corner
Liza Deines



Due to a space issue in Tuesday's *Norton Telegram*, this recipe was cut from Cook's Corner by Liza Deines.

It looked like a good recipe. Add it to your Christmas cooking list.
TASTY 'TATER MOUNDS
3/4 C. of cold mashed potatoes
4 C. powdered sugar
4 C. angel flake coconut
6 ounces semi-sweet chocolate chips
1/3 C. melted paraffin
Start working powdered sugar into mashed potatoes, a bit at a time, when it begins to come together, work in coconut. This will take time — sit down to do it and be patient. Should have the texture of a stiff cookie dough. Roll mixture into small balls and set on cookie sheet in freezer to firm up. Meanwhile, using a double boiler, melt chocolate chips and

paraffin together until smooth. Keep warm but not hot. Do not use microwave for this. If no double boiler, set a pyrex bowl over a pan of boiling water, not touching the water. Be careful with the paraffin as it can flame up unexpectedly. When coconut balls are firm, prepare a large foil-covered sheet pan. Using two toothpicks pushed into each side of ball just a little way, dip each ball in the warm chocolate mixture and set to cool on foil. Do not touch with fingers and don't skimp on the chocolate. Store in refrigerator. Variations: Can be tinted pink with maraschino cherry juice and dipped in melted cherry chips or white chocolate; or replace half or all the coconut with chunky peanut butter and dip in melted butter-scotch chips or milk chocolate chips. A plateful of the different kinds really decorates a holiday snack table.
