Colby College's Adams dies

COLBY — Although he was not always formally dressed like other college athletic directors, Colby Community College's Carl Adams was still doing the work of an athletic director.

Adams, 53, died Friday at Citizens Medical Center in Colby.

"He was not out there wearing a suit and tie," said Colby Community College President Dr. Lynn Kreider. "But he was doing things not a lot of ADs do. He was doing what needed to be done."

A 1971 graduate of Hoxie High School, Adams played baseball at Colby Community College from 1971-1973. After college, he raised hogs with his father but returned to Colby college in 1984.

In 1999, Adams was named athletic director. Duties include scheduling games, working with coaches, the Jayhawk conference and the National Junior College Athletic Association, plus other responsibilities.

"We have people working on those things and reviewing grades. But what are we going to do for an interim?" Kreider said. "It leaves a big hole."

Before Adams was named athletic director, he directed the softball team to success.

In 1985 he was an assistant women's basketball coach and softball coach. Colby softball began play in 1985. He was named head coach in 1987.

According to college archives, during Adams' first year the Trojan softball team went 17-19 and finished third in the region tournament. In Adams' first five seasons, the Trojans posted an overall record of 131-102. Two players received All-American honors, Dana Reep and Cara Brown.

In 1992 the Trojans were ranked

in the top 10 all season in the NJCAA poll before being upset in the Region 6 tournament. They finished the year 35-15

During the 1995 season, Coach Adams recorded his 200th win.

Over the next five years, the Trojans went 142-115.

In 1997 Colby Community College joined the Jayhawk West Conference. During their first year in the Jayhawk West, the Trojan softball team won the conference with a record of 39-13. Last season, Adams was named Jayhawk West coach of the year. More than 60 of his players continued playing at four-year schools.

Entering his 20th season, Adams had a record of 552-467.

Other than softball, the Trojans had plenty of success among its programs under Adams' direction. Last season, the women's basketball team competed at the national tournament for the first time in school history. The Trojan wrestling team has sent many individu-

als to the national tournament. Colby wrestling won nationals in 1999.

In November, Trojan women cross country runner Betty Rotich crossed the finish line first at the national meet.

Adams was involved in the college's Backer Club and Ambassador Club, both of which serve as public relation groups for the college.

"The Backers meet weekly," Kreider said. "Carl made sure everyone was at that meeting. He tried to make the coaches more vocal."

One of Adams' first positions at the college was a coordinator for one of the school's dormitories. He lived on campus. He was also involved in the city of Colby's recreation department. He served as president at one time.

Funeral services were held Wednesday at the Colby United Methodist Church.

Burial followed at Hoxie Cemetery.

Northern Valley High School senior Kelli Cole, signed a letter of intent to play volleyball at Cloud County Community College in Concordia.

She was a four-year letter winner in high school, playing setter and hitter.

She also received league and all-area honors.

The daughter of Jim and Monica Cole of Long Island, Kelli plans to major in business.
