Kiwanis Queens, Staccato Notes Federated Club, RSVP Choir Director and volunteer, Wives of Retired Faculty Men. She also enjoyed knit, crewel, teaching piano lessons and being a grandparent. She and her husband traveled, fished, golfed and exercised. Preceding her in death were her parents, her husband; her first-born son, Edwin L. Heinze, Jr.; a daughter, Linda L. Thorn; a son-in-law, Robert A. Schultz; a brother; and three sisters.
