## Nurse practitioner receives service award

The Kansas Emergency Medical Services Association gave Patricia McCartney, Norton, the 2007 Support Person of the Year award at its annual conference Aug. 18 in Wichita.

Ms. McCartney is the medical advisor to the Norton County Emergency Medical Service.

In June of 2006, the Norton County service was notified by its medical director, Dr. Jeff McKinley, that, because of the retirement of another doctor and an increase in patients, he could no longer fill the position. Shortly after, the Norton County Hospital hired Ms. McCartney, a nurse practitioner with experience in



pre-hospital care. After much discussion between the Norton County Commissioners, hospital administrator, Dr. McKinley and Ms. McCartney, Dr. McKinley withdrew his resignation and agreed to continue as the service's medical director with the assistance of Ms. McCartney, who would serve as medical oversight under Dr. McKinley's guidance.

Since Ms. McCartney has been involved with the county's ambulance service, she has assisted with a needs assessment and gap analysis to determine the training needs of the department, monthly training sessions, medical protocol re-

view and development, communications with the county commissioners, the hiring of new employees and monthly participation in quality assurance sessions. Because of her involvement, the department has experienced an improvement in the standards of care given to ambulance patients.

## Man taken to hospital after semi accident

An 82-year-old Norton man was taken to the hospital after wrecking a semi truck Tuesday.
