Huskies fall to top-rated Wildcats

The Wallace County High School football Wildcats, top-ranked in their classification and now 9-0 on the season, solidified that ranking with a 56-0 victory over the Northern Valley Huskies at Almena last Thursday night.

The Wildcats, from Sharon Springs, scored 34 points in the opening quarter and 22 in the second and final period.

Coach Chuck Fessenden's chart shows Northern Valley (1-8) with only 28 yards overall (19 on the ground and 9 in the air) while the Wildcats were 178 on the ground and 82 from up above for 260 yards.

First downs found the Wildcats with 5 and the Huskies 4. Penalties found the Huskies flagged twice for 10 yards and Sharon Springs 3 times for 20 yards.

Northern Valley fumbled 5 times and lost 2. The visitors were clean in that department.

Punts found the Huskies kicking 4 times for 90 yards (a 22.5 average). Sharon Springs didn't punt at all. Scoring for the visitors were: Taylor Elder, 13 yard run, Alex Howard pass from Jeff Hennick for the 2-point conversion; Ty Bieker 31 yard pass from Hennick, Tyler O'Connor run for 2-point conversion; team

safety, 2 points; Hennick 13-yard run, Howard pass from Hennick for 2-point conversion; Elder 15-yard run, Braden Lucas run for 2-point conversion; Hennick 3-yard run, Howard pass from Hennick, 2-point conversion; Lucas 17-yard interception return, PAT failed; Lucas 70-yard run, Austin Buell run for the 2-point conversion.

"We met the Lady Buffaloes for the second time this season but again could not come away with a win," said Norton head coach Peggy Cox.

"We played at a consistent level but there was no zing to spark our momentum. We passed extremely well but could not capitalize that

into kills.

"Our girls did have some really good hits but Atwood did a nice job of digging the ball up. Again, serving continues to plague us and we continue to work on this during practice."

Hayli Bozarth led in kills with 3, followed by Courtney Cox, Courtney LeClair, Lacy Keilig, 2 each; Katharine Roy, Ashli Hageman, Sara Lentz, 1 each.

Ashlie Stewart led in serving with 2 aces, followed by Cox, LeClair, Roy, 1 each.

"We continued to play very well but not good enough to beat the state ranked Lady Eagles," said coach Cox.

"Passing from our back row has really become a strong point for us and while kills, kill percentage and serving was much improved from the Atwood match, it was not to be a win for the women in blue. We are a much-improved team from the beginning of the season but, to beat teams that are state-ranked, we have to play strong in all aspects of the game.

"Our blocking continues to be

a weak point for us and while we are touching more hits, we aren't converting touches to stuff blocks and resulting points.

"This will continue to be a point of emphasis for us in practice as it has been every day and, hopefully, with some changes, will become a point winner for us the rest of the season."

Bozarth led in kills with 6, followed by Keilig, 5; LeClair, 3; Cox, Lentz, 2 each; Roy, 1.

Serving leaders were Thea Wiseman and Ashley Colip with 2 aces each, followed by LeClair, Roy, 1 each.

Norton played Ulysses first.

"This match was very frustrating," said Norton head volleyball coach Peggy Cox. "We couldn't shut down their two hitters and our hitters couldn't find holes to make enough points on kills. I was

hoping we would make points on blocks since it was obvious whom Ulysses was setting but that didn't happen either."

Hayli Bozarth led Norton in kills with 7, followed by Courtney LeClair, 4; Courtney Cox, Sara Lentz, 3 each; Ashlie Hageman, 2.

Bozarth had 1 block. Katharine Roy and Ashlie Stewart each had 1 serving ace.

Digs leader was Stewart with

8, followed by Cox, 6; Roy, 5; Shelby Jones, 2; Hageman, Lentz, 1 each.

Cox led in assists with 9, followed by Ashley Colip, 7; Roy, 1.

"This was a fairly evenly matched contest between our Lady Jays and the Lady Cowgirls with our Jays avenging an earlier loss," said Cox. "We served aggressively and hit well in this match.

"Our team had 34 kills and 11 aces to rack up 45 points. LeClair, Bozarth and Lentz were our go-to-ladies tonight with 10, 9 and 7 kills, respectively, with Cox assisting in 20 of those kills. We

also put up six blocks for points with LeClair again playing the net very well."

Keilig had 4 kills, Cox had 3 and Hageman 1. LeClair led in blocks with 2, followed by Bozarth, Hageman, Keilig, Lentz, 1 each.

Stewart was serving leader with 3 aces, followed by Cox, LeClair, Lentz, 2 each; Colip, Roy, 1 each. Roy led in digs with 8, followed by Cox, Jones, 5 each; Colip, Stewart, 4 each; Lentz, 3; Bozarth, Ellis, Hageman, Keilig, LeClair, 1 each.

Colip had 8 assists while LeClair, Lentz and Stewart had 1 each.

HEART IMPLANT LEAD DEFECTS

On October 14, 2007, Medtronic announced a defect in the electrical "lead" wire of its heart defibrillator and recalled the product. Affected models of the Sprint Fidelis defibrillator leads are 6930, 6931, 6948 and 6949. A fracture in the lead wire can lead to unnecessary, painful shocks to patients and may require replacement surgery. At least five deaths have been reported in patients with the defective leads.


