In Romans 12:10 and 13:7 there is a special Greek word that is translated as "honor" (*time*). The application for us is to ascribe to a person his worth and/or give recognition of another's worth. It is now our privilege to give recognition about the faithfulness in prayer Doris Stump showed toward the CrossRoads ministry since fall of 2000.
