William J. Ryan June 11, 1936 - Nov. 20, 2007

William Johnson "Jay" Ryan, 71, long-time Norton attorney, died Nov. 20 at the Norton County Hospital.

The son of William B. and Alois (Johnson) Ryan, he was born June 11, 1936, in Smith Center.

Mr. Ryan attended Norton schools and Kansas State University. He graduated from the Washburn University School of Law.

On Dec. 21, 1962, he and Roberta Jo Wray were married in Norton, where he had established his law practice.

Mr. Ryan was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Norton and was active in the church choir, Methodist Men, and had served on the Board of Trustees. He was a member of the Norton Lions Club and had served on the Norton City Council, Andbe Home Board, Norton-Decatur Co-op Board, City Beautification, and as President of the Chamber of Commerce.

He was a past county and city attorney and was a member of the Washburn University School of Law Association Board of Governors and was admitted to practice

law before the U.S. Supreme Court. He was also appointed to the Kansas Bar Association Ethics Committee. He was a member of Phi Alpha Delta law fraternity and Delta Tau Delta social fraternity. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge, Isis Shrine and a past member of the Air Force Reserves.

He was preceded in death by his parents and one nephew, John C. Ryan.
