After becoming a registered nurse, she returned to Norton where she was Superintendent of Nurses at the old Norton Hospital.

During this time, she married Lewis Randall. They enjoyed a happy, but brief, marriage due to his death. She also worked as a surgery nurse at the Norton Sanitarium, later returning to the Norton Hospital where she worked on the surgery and obstetrics floor for many years. Following her retirement, she even worked several years without pay.

She married Philip Wallack in 1955. He died in 1970.

Mrs. Wallack was a member of the Norton United Methodist Church and served on the committee that prepared and served funeral dinners. She was a charter member of the New Century Federated Club and held many offices in that organization. She enjoyed playing bridge and doing crochet work. She grew many varieties of roses and understood their proper

care. She enjoyed music and especially enjoyed hearing her granddaughter, Sue Ann Stutheit, sing and play the piano.

She was preceded in death by her parents, three husbands, three brothers, one sister, two step-sons and an infant daughter.
