Distribution will begin at 9:30 a.m. Saturday, June 28 at the senior center.

The June Prairie Land Food Package contains 1.22 pounds of lean country ham steak, 1 pound of popcorn chicken, 3.5 pounds of Buffalo-style chicken pizza, 1 pound of flame-broiled beef steak strips, 1 pound of turkey breakfast sausage and 12 ounces of deli sliced ham plus 6 to 8 different fresh fruits and vegetables.

For \$23.50 and two hours of volunteer service you may purchase a food package. A package must be purchased before adding additional packages of food.

A meat only pak is \$13 plus on additional hour of service and a veggie package is \$11 plus one additional hour of service.

There are three June specials. Special No. 1 is a stuffed chicken breast special. For \$13 and one more hour of volunteer service you will receive 4, 6-ounce fully cooked chicken cordon bleu and 4, 6-ounce fully cooked chicken and broccoli and cheese.
