William D. "Bill" Jansonius, son of Jake and Ella (DeWitt) Jansonius, was born June 6, 1914 on a farmstead north of Luctor. He was the oldest of five children. He died on Thursday, July 17, 2008 at the Norton County Hospital, at the age of 94 years.

He grew up on the family farm southeast of Prairie View, and attended White Hall County Grade School. He was a member of the Luctor Christian Reformed Church and served as deacon and elder of the consistory.

He married Grada Van Kooten April 2, 1940 at the bride's home southeast of Long Island. To this union, three children were born: Evalene Joyce, Willard Gale, and Cleo James.

They lived south of Prairie View, where Mr. Jansonius enjoyed farming and raising cattle. He and Grada spent most of their married life on the farm, moving into Prairie View in 1997. He resided in Prairie View until July 4,

2008 when he became ill.
