New car wash downtown now open

Tony and Verla Grysch, Norton, have bought the building and property, and turned it into a self-service car wash.

Before moving to Norton in March 2006, Mr. Grysch had owned a full-service car wash in Mission. They moved here to be closer to Mrs. Grysch's mother.

Mr. Grysch is a self-described "small town boy at heart," and wanted to do something to help keep the downtown area alive.

"I'm a Nortonite by marriage, and it's important to me to be part of the community," said Mr. Grysch.

"We wanted to save the architecture of the old building," said Mr. Grysch. It was a two bay gas station. We remodeled the existing bays. One was turned into the equipment room, and the other is now the automatic car wash bay. We added two bays on the north side, which are the self-serve bays. Those two north bays are large enough to fit irregular vehicles like travel trailers, motor homes and bucket trucks.'

The water used at the car wash is softened water, and the spotfree rinse uses reverse osmosis water, so there won't be any watermarks on vehicles. The temperature of the high pressure wash is 120 degrees.

"Hot, softened water makes the soaps work better," said Mr. Grysch.

When Mr. Grysch started construction on his car wash, he decided to use all local contractors for the work.

Mr. Grysch said he will let kids hold fund raisers at his car

"I want to give something back to the community. The kids can use a self-serve bay for the day, they can offer to dry the vehicles and even vacuum them if they want. I would like to help as much as I can," said Mr. Grysch.

Mr. Grysch even chose the colors of his car wash — blue and yellow — to show his support for the students.

"I'm not in this just for the money," said Mr. Grysch. "It's also about community enhancement."

Though the car wash is open now, there will be a grand opening at an as yet undetermined time. Mr. Grysch plans for it to be during the morning hours, and to serve refreshments.

"I have been very pleased with the cleaners I purchased," said Mr. Grysch. "We use the best products available in the market, and the customers have been very pleased, too, because it's just more fun to drive a clean car.


