Tiebreaker again figures in this week's winner

She said the school has 200 tickets to sell at \$7 each with the high school choir to receive half the proceeds.

"The students' behavior and preparedness was exemplary and they were excellent representatives of Norton Community High School and the Norton community," Tamra Cochran said.
